Dear Prospective Resident,

Thank you for your interest in the prospect of living in Christian community at the Menno Simons Centre this summer! The opportunity for shared communal life is a tremendous privilege that we welcome you to explore with us. Please take the time to read and consider the Menno Simons Centre as a place to live, grow and contribute during your summer in Vancouver.

The Menno Simons Centre, formerly a Catholic Convent, is a residence hall located 4 kms from UBC and Regent College in the residential area of Point Grey. This residence is operated by a not-for-profit society founded on Anabaptist ideals and seeks to provide a supportive community for Christian University and College students. Summer residents are not required to be in a course of study, however, preference may be given to students enrolled in summer classes. Residents seeking housing from May through August will also be given preference.

Living in the Centre is defined by shared life together and the pursuit of Jesus Christ as a community. In this environment, spiritual growth as an individual and as a corporate body, are a part of daily life. The Centre strives to be a place where Christians engage one another and their university studies, with a particular emphasis on Anabaptist practice and thought. Shared life together includes meals, school studies, music, tears, laughter, play, struggle, learning, prayer, Bible studies, dialogue, and much more, including the gifts you have to bring.

As with any healthy community, there are standards of living you should be aware of and be ready to put into practice. When living at the Centre, residents commit to more than a rent payment and receive in return, more than a dorm where they lay their heads:

- As a way to care for the facility and those we live with, we share in the weekly tasks of cleaning and maintaining the Centre.
- All residents are invited to enjoy a weekly potluck meal on Wednesday evenings.
- We encourage optional small-group book studies or Bible studies.
- Our commitment to community also calls us to create a hospitable space for the Fall residents to come, so you will be expected to work two hours in cleaning and projects on Saturday, August 27, 2011.
- Further, the use of alcohol, tobacco, harmful drugs and involvement in behaviour detrimental to Christian community are not permitted on the MSC premises.

The MSC Full Value Contract has further details about these standards of living and is available on our website for your reading convenience.

The Centre has small individual rooms furnished with a bed, desk, closet and bookshelf. Many also have a sink. There are two fully-furnished kitchens for student use. In addition, there is a large dining room, a study lounge, a small chapel, a recreation lounge, coin-laundry facilities and a bike storage room. If you do not have your own phone, there is one common phone that is provided for local calls free of charge. A bus stop is located one block from the Centre and it takes about 10 minutes to take the bus to UBC. Residents can also bike to campus in about 15 minutes.

We have set up a cable-modem based wireless 802.11g/n network for Internet access throughout the Centre and all student rooms. If you do not already have your own wireless adaptor you may be able to borrow one, subject to availability. If you wish to use the shared Internet connection you will be expected to sign an Appropriate Use Policy. If you would prefer your own dedicated high-speed connection, you have the option of providing your own.

One final note about the building – the Centre is occasionally used for worship, workshops and recreation by non-residents. The Point Grey Inter-Mennonite Fellowship meets in the Centre's chapel on Sunday mornings and warmly welcomes you to participate in their worship services and share in their monthly potluck lunches.

Your application should be submitted with a \$50.00 application fee which is non-refundable EXCEPT in the event that you are not accepted to the educational institution you applied to. Applications are reviewed beginning in February, and every month thereafter, after which you will be notified of your status. If accepted, a non-refundable \$250 damage/holding deposit is required to secure your room. Exact details of all residence fees are found on the application form. If you move out in the middle of the summer year (May-August), you will forfeit either the remainder of that prepaid semester's rent or your holding/damage deposit (whichever is greater).

Please fill out the following two pages of the application form and mail your completed application form and the \$50 application fee to us as soon as possible. We are excited about the possibility of living with you and learning from you this summer!
